Families are encouraged to take time each day to engage in literacy-related activities – even just 15 minutes a day can dramatically improve the literacy skills of both children and parents.

Winter is here!

The weather has certainly been unpredictable but it is essential that the students come to school dressed for outdoor play. The children are outside for all recesses and they should be dressed appropriately. It is a great idea for your child to have an extra pair of mitts and socks as these do get wet! Neck warmers or very short scarves are preferable to long ones that have to be tied. Please write your child's name on his/her coat, pants, mitts and boots. When there is an extreme wind chill factor, the students are kept indoors and provided with alternate activities.

A friendly reminder, that there are children in our school with severe, life threatening allergies to peanuts and nuts. We maintain a peanut and nut aware school community, **peanut and nut products are not permitted.**

Medication

We cannot dispense medication to a student unless it is prescribed by a physician. All medication must be kept at the office with written instructions.
